- 1. Please note that multiple scholarships may be held by the successful applicant together with University and other external scholarships.
- 2. **Minor scholarships** (up to \$5,000 towards College fees) are offered by the College on the basis of demonstrated academic achievement and/ or community service. New students will be considered automatically for these scholarships, which will be offered after **Major Scholarships** have been awarded (allowing the College to consider demonstrated financial need as its highest priority).
- 3. **Major scholarships** (from \$5,000 to \$20,000) are offered by the College on the basis of demonstrated financial need through the College's bursary application form.

College Major and Minor Scholarships (\$2,000 to \$20,000): up to 25 awarded annually towards residential fees, to new and returning students on the basis of demonstrated financial need, academic merit, and community service.

Indigenous Scholarship (\$15,000): awarded annually towards residential fees, to a new or returning student with focus on biomedicine or science leading to a graduate medical degree.

Country Scholarships (\$3,000 to \$20,000): up to 20 awarded annually towards residential fees, to new and returning students from country Victoria on the basis of demonstrated financial need, academic merit, and community service.

First in Family Scholarships (\$10,000): up to 3 awarded annually towards residential fees, to students who are the first in their family to attend University.

Music Scholarships (up to \$20,000): up to 3 awarded annually towards residential fees, to students studying in a Music degree.

Women's Scholarships (\$5,000 to \$20,000): up to 15 awarded annually towards residential fees, to new and returning female undergraduate students on the basis of demonstrated financial need, academic merit, and community service.

Service Scholarships (up to \$10,000): 2 awarded annually towards residential fees, to new and returning students with particular regard to community service.
